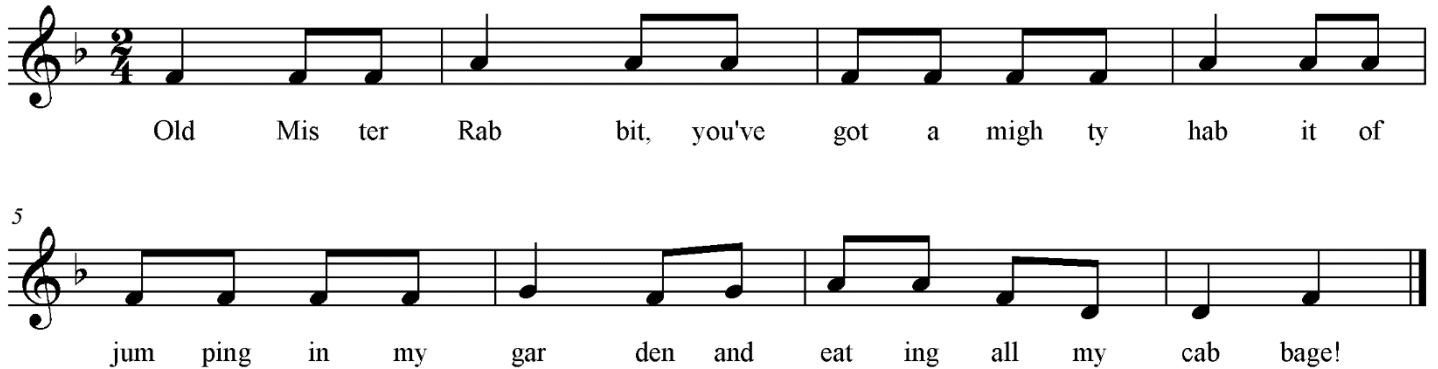

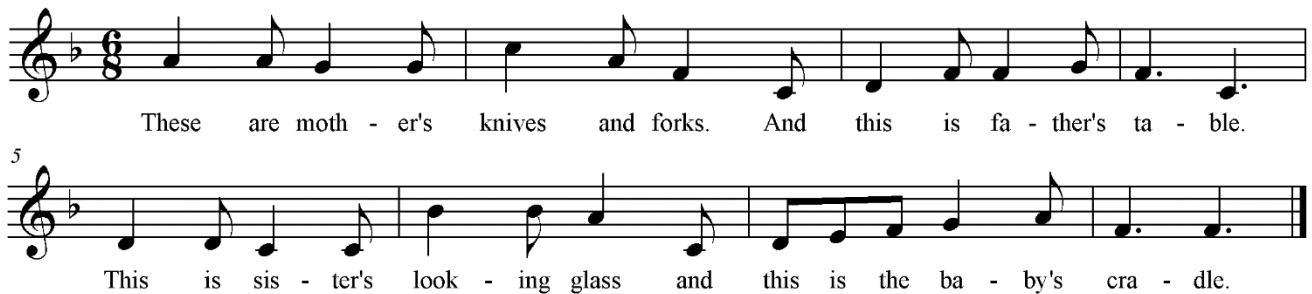

These Are Mother's Knives and Forks

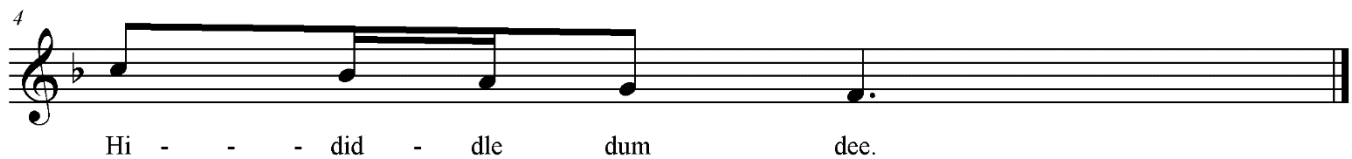
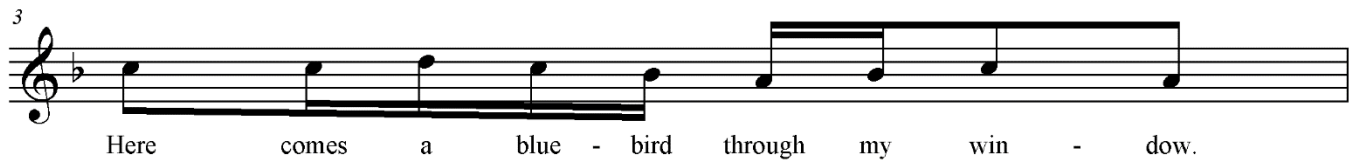
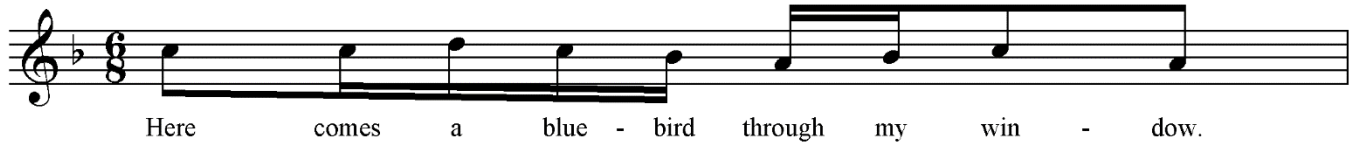


Motions:
